Craig Steven Cobb, a native Clevelander, received his bachelor's degree from Miami University and his Juris Doctorate degree from Cleveland Marshall Law School. Initially in private practice, he later served as an Assistant Director of Law for the City of Cleveland and as a judicial law clerk at the Ohio Court of Appeals, Eighth District. He also spent time as an acting Referee for the Cleveland Civil Service Commission.

In 1988 he was appointed by Mayor George Voinovich as one of the first members of the newly created Civilian Police Review Board, serving as its chairman and vice-chairman. In 1993, he was appointed by Ohio Attorney General Lee Fisher to serve on the Ohio Consumers Counsel Governing Board, a position he held until his appointment to the municipal bench. In 1994, Governor George Voinovich appointed Cobb to fill an unexpired term in Cleveland Municipal Court.
